WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

Our Preschoolers explored all of their senses this week. During our math lessons we explored different sets that we can find, make and use. Our main focus was a lunchbox set, consisting of a sandwich, a milk, and an apple. The children went on a listening walk, where they used their big ears to identify and recognise different sounds they heard. We have had a lot of excitement this week and it will continue next week for our International day!



As we leave this week behind, we realise what a fabulous week this has been! We said goodbye to Gruffalo by making our adventure boxes, we learnt new sounds and new tricky words. In Maths, we learnt one more one less, and the composition of numbers up to 5 and we added another rhyme to the ones we learnt so far. We delved deeper into our scientific enquiry of animal types and we particularly enjoyed learning about amphibians.

In Art, we have been learning all about Cave Art and painting Cave Art animals. In history, we have been exploring stone age artefacts and predicting what they were used for. In science, we have continued to learn about healthy eating and diet!

It's been a busy week in Year 6! We have been working hard with our learning partners to edit, uplevel and improve our Hot Tasks, ready for publishing! Our Grammar lesson on metaphors has helped us to create some fabulous WW2 descriptions. In Maths, we have looked at the importance of using BODMAS to navigate our way through tricky equations. Well done Year 6!
